Chairmen's Message

This report is to bring you upto-date with what has been happening at Aldenham Parish Council (APC) since our last newsletter. We write this report as we bask in tropical hot weather,

a welcome arrival after the very disappointing wet May.

One of the main items to report to you is the arrival of three new Councillors. We welcome Cllr John Graham, already known to many of you as he is a Borough and County Councillor, Cllr Shaun Wilson and Cllr Claire Diskin. They bring to the Council a wealth of experience in finance, local government, fund raising and disability issues. We look forward to working with our new Councillors on many new initiatives.

When we last wrote to you, we reported that due to the covid pandemic we were meeting virtually via zoom. This has now come to an end, as the government did not extend the emergency legislation which enabled zoom meetings, beyond 17 May. Therefore, our Full Council, Finance & General Purposes and Planning meetings are now taking place in a covid compliant way at The Radlett Centre (However, members of the public can only view the meetings via zoom).

We have taken the opportunity to address how we carry out APC business and going forward have decided to replace the Open Spaces Committee and the Community Development Committee with working parties in order to allow the public to get more involved with their local community.

There are several working parties which may be of interest to you. These include a new initiative to look at Disability issues within the Parish and one looking at Green issues. In relation to these and other meetings, we are still permitted to meet by zoom as these are not statutory committees.

The Radlett Neighbourhood Plan has now been adopted so going forward, APC's Planning Committee, which is a statutory consultee,

will be applying the Policies when considering applications. Hertsmere's Officers and the Planning Committee, which is the deciding authority, must also take account of the Policies. Also, Radlett will now receive 25% of CIL monies (Community Infrastructure Levy) going forward, an increase of 10%. If you are a local organisation who would like to apply for a CIL Grant for a capital project, please apply to APC for an application form.

As many of you with young children or grandchildren will know, it has been a tradition for many years in Radlett to host summer activities for school age children at the Rec during August. Last year sadly these events did not take place and we were unsure whether we would manage to put together any sort of programme this year. However, working with Inspire All, it looks like some exciting activities will take place on two Monday mornings in August. Please see further details about the activities on page 13 of this magazine and for information about how to book your child's place.

We would like to place on record our thanks to our Council Manager, Peter Evans and Deputy, Monika Duong for ensuring our Council meetings can go ahead in a Government compliant way. Our thanks must also go to all the APC staff who have worked so hard during these past months to take care of our Open Spaces and attend to Council matters.

We wish you all a wonderful summer, even if at this stage, the prospect of a foreign holiday looks unlikely.

Since the Radlett Youth Council was first able to hold virtual meetings in January 2021, we have been delighted to get active as a youth forum for Radlett. We are also very happy to have selected Herts Young Homeless as our worthy charity for our fundraising efforts over the next year; we hope to use a mix of virtual and, fingers crossed, in person events to raise money for this important local charity.

We have been involved in various local projects. We have been involved in the consultations for the art installations at Radlett Station and hope to continue giving a youth voice on this work. We hope that our input is valuable and helpful for the Council.

Brilliant Effort From Communities 1st Volunteers



Just over a year ago and in the wake of new restrictions, Communities 1st was faced with an array of unprecedented challenges that shook both the inner workings of the charity and the services we had to offer.

As we amassed the support of nearly three thousand volunteer applications in the first few weeks we had to adapt and develop our customer relationship management system dramatically just to cope with the heavy load on our recruitment team. Whereas before we were managing just sixty people at a time, we now had to ask many of our volunteers to assist in signing up others and before long we had the support of six thousand.

With the support of local councils and the formation of 'Community Help Hertfordshire' we expanded to provide both essential and non-essential services including personal shopping and prescription services for vulnerable people as well as our telephone befriending and leaflet programmes. Alongside a few other organisations, we were approached by the NHS to support their vaccination programme and by the time of the roll-out we had garnered the support and publicity of figures such as the Lord Lieutenant of Hertfordshire as well as a wave of donations that we continued to distribute to those who needed them most. From pallets full of flowers from gardens centres through to hundreds of mince pies over the Christmas period we were overcome with the warmth and kindness of our community.

We feel incredibly honoured to have now completed over 100,000 hours of Vaccination Volunteering and are struck by the resilience and bravery of our thousands of volunteers who stood to fight the virus as the communities went to receive their first and second dose. As the next chapter grows near, we look forward to seeing how the community will stand together in the many years to come.

Fair Field Junior School and APC's Open Spaces Partnership

In Autumn 2020, the Nature Nurturer and Eco Warrior Leaders of Fair Field Junior School met with representatives of Aldenham Parish Council, including David Jenkins (member of APC Open Spaces Team) to draw up exciting plans for a partnership with APC's Open Spaces. As a result of this partnership, children from across the school, who are part of these crews are now involved in a range of activities on APC land.

A major feature of the project is to encourage children to be outside with nature. The children are now monitoring bird and bat boxes and have planted spring bulbs. The Fair Field pupils visit the Phillimore Recreation Ground every Thursday to carry out various planned tasks.

Aldenham Parish Council are excited to be working in partnership with a local school and would like to place on record our thanks to David Jenkins, for introducing us to this amazing initiative.

A fitting thanks to Lady Phillimore who gave over the Recreation Ground to the Parish Council a hundred years ago back in 1921 in order that the local community could enjoy using it. The history of Phillimore Recreation Ground and Radlett Gardens



Phillimore Recreation Ground was presented to Radlett in 1921 as a memorial to the recently deceased Robert Phillimore. It was left largely untouched until 1930. The bowling pavilion was also built at this time.

As Robert's widow Lucy had provided much of the money, she came to open it in July of that year. At that time, on



impulse, she also donated an extra strip of land next to the Recreation Ground. She had originally intended this strip for housing, but it became a children's play area, and remains so to this day. The Herts Advertiser reported 18 July 1930: '...she noticed how a good deal of what were once open spaces were being built on, so they had to do something in Radlett before their open spaces were used up'.



Prior to Phillimore's donation, land for the Radlett Gardens Recreation Area on Watling Street, was gifted in 1900 by Radlett landowner and Chairman of Aldenham Parish Council, Charles Part. It is found between Barclay's Bank and the filling station, Regency House. On 26 May 1900, the Herts Advertiser published the following:- 'The Chairman... expressed a desire to hand over to the council the piece of land near Radlett station which he had on a former occasion provided as a recreation ground for the village. The clerk was also instructed to make these powers known to Mr Phillimore with the hope that he would do the same with Scrubbitts.' Which he did!

In 1957, Radlett Gardens was offered for sale but, after strong local opposition, a public meeting was called. After a conclusive vote, it was decided to keep it, in line with Charles Part's original intention, and it survives today as a permanent open space 'for peace and contemplation'.

In case you're wondering, the 'Recreation Ground' is a fare stage/stop in the local 602 bus timetables...so now you know!

Community Infrastructure Levy Grants

The Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) is a charge that local authorities can set on new developments in order to raise funds to upgrade the infrastructure, facilities and services, such as schools or transport improvements, which are needed to

support new homes and businesses in the area. As part of this levy, Aldenham Parish Council (APC) automatically receive 15% of any CIL levied on developments within the parish. Due to the recently adopted Radlett Neighbourhood Plan, APC will now receive a further 10% of CIL collected from developments within the Radlett Neighbourhood Plan area only, which can then be spent on the capital projects within the whole parish.

In June 2020, APC announced the CIL capital grants scheme for local voluntary organisations and community groups. The scheme is to help fund capital projects within the parish.

APC has set aside funding from the CIL to invest in the local community with grants of between $\pounds1,000$ to $\pounds20,000$ available to applicants for capital spending. Core organisational costs such as salaries, rent or utilities are not eligible.

So far grants totalling £20,312.85 have been awarded to 3 local organisations:

• Radlett Bowls Club -- £1,562.85 towards repairs to the surrounds at the ground and £2,500 towards a new pump for the sprinkler system

• 1st Radlett Scouts -- £10,000 for new front entrance to Scout Hut

• Aldenham War Memorial Hall -- £8,750 towards the creation of a centenary garden at the Hall

All grants awarded are subject to production of satisfactory invoices prior to funds being released.

APC are pleased to confirm that the Radlett Bowls Club completed their project and the following statement was received from the club:

"We, at Radlett Bowls Club (RBC) are most grateful to APC for the Community Infrastructure Grant. RBC was established in 1933 on a sloping site bordering Phillimore Recreation

Ground. The ground was levelled for the actual green but the banks remained sloping. Sometime later some bays for bench seating were cut out of the banks, the backs being supported with wooden staves and piling.

Over time these have all rotted away and the generous infrastructure grant was used to replace them with specially treated sleepers for such support work.



This health and safety and solidification work has greatly improved RBC's ambiance both visually and practically. All can see how much we care and look after our club. Our members regularly benefit from exercise, fresh open air and really good company. We provide information on bowling techniques and can show our new members how to bowl and benefit from our matches. Since our last update, we have continued to navigate our way through a number of restrictions brought upon us on by COVID 19. A further lockdown has meant changes to the way many of us spent the winter months, but I am hoping that we are finally beginning to see light at the end of the tunnel. We have continued to witness some fantastic examples of community spirit, with many taking the time to help and assist one another when the need has arisen.

Our policing team continues to grow with the arrival of two new officers:

• PC Wonnacott, who amongst his regular duties will be targeting fly tipping throughout Aldenham and Bushey

• PCSO James, who comes with a wealth of experience having previously worked in Bushey

Our most reported crime continues to be theft from motor vehicles, with a marked increase nationally in theft of catalytic converters. The rise in catalytic convertor thefts has coincided with the rise in the price of metals found within the converters. We are conducting dedicated patrols as a result of these thefts and are working hard to combat this type of crime. 
